Mary Alice Nibbe was born in Oak Park, Illinois on November 29, 1929. She was raised in Waukegan, Illinois where she attended both grade school and high school. She graduated Salutatorian and was Lieutenant in women's ROTC. She lettered in swimming and focused on English and literature. After high school, she attended Drake University for two years then joined "FCC 49ers", a youth Christian group helping with Bible Schools and surveying the population in small towns around Illinois. Her group leader was Dan LaMaster from Lacygne, Kansas. They returned together to Kansas the winter of 1949 and were married in the fall of 1950. Both attended KU in Lawrence, KS and both graduated in 1952. Mary held a degree in Education. They traveled in Oklahoma and Kansas pastoring in small churches for 3 years. They had 3 sons, Rick, Fred and Peter. Dan decided to pursue a career in aviation mfg. from Wichita to Florida and Mary was a homemaker, Den master, Boy Scout leader and part time teacher and substitute in both English and remedial reading classes.

Mary and Dan were divorced in 1967 and Mary continued her teaching at Derby High School in Derby, Kansas until 1977.

She was always heavily involved with her church family working on the bulletin, knitting and crocheting any and everything for anyone and being a greeter and Deaconess.

While attending Broadway Christian Church in Wichita in 1975 she met and married Wilfred Rutledge and moved to his home in Wichita, KS. Wilfred was retired from Beech Craft Aircraft Corp. as a quality inspector. They were both integral parts of the church and its outreach. Wilfred passed away unexpectedly in 1995. Mary continued her church work and was focusing on the homebound ministry for the church. Through this ministry she met and married Glenn Stark in 1999. Glenn was a retired Baptist minister and Pearl Harbor survivor on the USS Maryland. They lived together at Glenn's homestead in Kingman, KS and traveled together for a few years as Glenn pastored in some small churches throughout the Flint Hills area of KS. Glenn developed health issues and passed away September 2, 2014 at 99 years old.

Mary moved to Manhattan, Kansas near her oldest son Rick LaMaster who is a retired Army Sargent E6 medical surgical op.

She attended First Christian Church, taught Bible study, and helped in outreach ministry.

Mary always enjoyed her daily walks of about 2-3 miles and rarely drove unless she had to. She was never without a knitting or crocheting project or a hand of help outstretched to anyone in need.

While on her walk September 6, 2017, Mary had a massive heart attack and passed away on the way to the hospital.

Her kindness, quick wit, dedication to her church and family will always be remembered by anyone with whom she came in contact.

She was very proud to be involved in her son Fred's work for the Boys and Girls Clubs of Saline County and got a full facility tour in June of 2016 after the annual family trip to Florida. She was amazed at the new facility and honored to be included with the LaMaster Family Tech Lab.
